To My Auxiliary Sisters:

I hope all Auxiliary moms, stepmoms and grandmoms had a wonderful Mother's Day and were treated extra specially, and I also hope everyone had the opportunity to honor our veterans during Armed Forces Week and on Memorial Day.

Our current membership numbers as recorded at National Headquarters are:

1,406 regular & associate members

1,213 life, associate life, LMAL's and PNP's

2,619 Total

As of June 30, 2018, we had a total of 2,731 so you can see we are 112 members below last year.

When our National Secretary sent me the membership numbers, she also enclosed additional information I'd like to share with you.

Transmittals:

- 14 units have not submitted transmittals for this year - 9 of those may be closed

Bond:

- 33 units/departments have not submitted their 2019 bonds
 - 13 units submitted transmittals but no bond form
 - 9 departments (one of which may have closed in January of 2018 and one that has not submitted a bond for the past 3 years)
 - 11 units may be closed

Installation Reports:

- 21 units and one department have not submitted installation reports
 - 1 unit since 2014
 - 2 units since 2015
 - 2 units since 2016
 - 16 units and one department since 2017

Even if your unit does not change officers, an installation report must be completed and the officers must be duly sworn in for a second term. The submission of the installation report is the responsibility of the installing officer.

With department conventions being held this month and the national convention just around the corner, there is still time to get your units in order by July 1 so no one will be in violation of National Bylaw Article One, National Convention, Section 105 – Credentials – Delegates, Alternates, Members, sub section C & D.

According to the National Bylaws, Article Four states Department Conventions are to be held each year between 1 May and 15 July. You may or may not have had yours yet. Article Five states, each Unit shall hold an annual election of officers after 1 September and no later than 15 May. You should have had yours by this time. Congratulations to all of the newly installed officers in their respective Units and Departments – I commend your dedication and willingness to take a leadership position. Ladies if you are a mom, grandmother, aunt a friend or Girl Scout leader of a girl in Girl Scouting please encourage her to pursue the Gold Award. Girls must be a Senior Scouts in High school, to work on the award. The decision is usually made during summer school break between Jr. and Sr. years in high school. But, knowing the value of doing the Gold Award may help influence a girl and her parents to help her want to pursue the Gold Award.

Girl Scout Councils have special ladies, usually volunteers, that work with the girls to help them in their decisions of doing the award and advice on how to proceed to achieve the award. There are meetings the girls attend and guidance is provided there for them to proceed with their project to do the award. To do the Gold Award it requires community service and demonstrating leadership skills. This is a learning experience which helps them have self-confidence to pursue other challenges in life. Colleges do look at Girl Scout Gold Awardees with favoritism because they know the challenge that a girl has to complete her award. Also, some councils present their girls with scholarships for college.

Speaking with the girls and parents in my council, a common thread is how the girls have been changed by their experience. Girls often comment about the self-confidence they have gained in connections with the process of doing their project. They also acquire leadership qualities they do not experience doing in any other way which will most likely help them in their future at college or at work.

SUBJ: In compliance with article Eight, Section 800 of the National Bylaws, Marine Corps League Auxiliary, I hereby submit, in triplicate, typewritten form, the following amendment to: Article Six, Members, Section 646 – Dual Membership (E).

CURRENTLY READS:

(E) Individual Units may decide on voting privileges on Unit issues for Dual Members beyond the primary Unit.

AMEND TO READ:

(E) Dual Members shall have the same rights at this Unit as her original membership eligibility allows, including the ability to hold office in each Unit.

BRIEF:

Full membership rights, as noted in Article 6 – Members, Section 630 – Rights of Members, states that no member shall be deprived of any right or privileges in the Marine Corps League Auxiliary.

RATIONALE:

Full membership rights include voting and holding an elected office. If a regular Member chooses to be a regular Member of another Unit, and is accepted by that Unit, she should be able to hold office just as other regular Members in that Unit.

EFFECTIVE DATE:

Following approval of the Marine Corps League National Judge Advocate but no later than January 1, 2020.

Subject: Incompliance with Article Eight, Miscellaneous, Section 800 – Amendments, National Bylaws, Marine Corps League Auxiliary, I hereby submit, in triplicate, typewritten form, the following amendment to Article Eight Miscellaneous, Section 800 - Amendments

Add:

Section 800 – Amendments

(a) All submissions for proposed changes to the National Bylaws, Marine Corps League Auxiliary shall have representation, by the maker or their assignee, on the floor of the convention at which it will be presented and voted on.

Brief: To ensure that any questions or concerns are answered with the most knowledge possible to avoid 'guessing' at the makers intentions.

Rationale: This will remove the need to question the maker(s) after the fact regarding their intentions and allow the proposed change to move forward for a vote by the body present.

Effective Date: Upon the approval of the National Judge Advocate of the Marine Corps League, but no later than 01 January 2020.

Add:

Section 800 – Amendments

(b) Submissions for proposed changes to the National Bylaws, Marine Corps League Auxiliary shall be voted on as submitted, with no changes or alternations prior to the vote by the body present at the convention.

Brief: To ensure that any discussion to remains on topic and allows for the vote to be straightforward.

Rationale: This will remove the possible confusion and uncertainty that can sometimes occur after a lengthy discussion and the need to re-explain what the vote will accomplish.

Effective Date: Upon the approval of the National Judge Advocate of the Marine Corps League, but no later than 01 January 2020.

Subject: In compliance with Article Eight, Section 800 of the National Bylaws, Marine Corps League Auxiliary, I hereby submit, in triplicate typewritten form, the following amendment to Article 5 Section: 503 – Subsection A “Treasurer Financial Records”

Currently Reads: SECTION 506- Subsection A: The Unit bank account shall be in the name of the Auxiliary and two signatures (President and Treasurer) are required on all checks and/or savings withdrawals. Accurate records must be kept for all receipts and disbursements. The records must show a detailed account on the expenditure of all funds such as: general expense, hospital, rehabilitation, fund raising project, etc. Treasurer’s books are to be audited every three months by the Auditing Committee.

Amend: SECTION 506 - Subsection A: The Unit bank account shall be in the name of the Auxiliary and minimum of two signatures (President and Treasurer) are required on the account. Accurate records must be kept for all receipts and disbursements. The records must show a detailed account on the expenditure of all funds such as: general expense, hospital, rehabilitation, fund raising project, etc. Treasurer’s books must be audited no less than one time per year prior to the installation of officers.

Brief: Delete that 2 signatures are required on all checks and/or savings withdrawals. Replace with required on the account. Delete, “books are to be audited every three months by the Auditing Committee”

Rationale: Having 2 signatures on the account is sufficient. It should be up to the Unit to decide if they need to have 2 signatures on the checks or withdrawals. In today society, debit cards are used in many instances for purchases; having two people present for such activity is not consistent with practices with debit card usage. A requirement cannot be in place for checks writing only and not the debit card usage. Auditing Unit books three times a year is unrealistic. Books should be audited prior to when new officers are installed and positions are filled. Units can enact more stringent requirements into their by-laws if they choose.

This would be effective after the approval of the National Judge Advocate of the Marine Corps League, no later than 01 January 2020

Subject: In compliance with Article Eight, Section 800 of the National Bylaws, Marine corps League Auxiliary, I hereby submit, in triplicate typewritten form, the following amendment to Chapter 2 in the Administrative Procedures Section: 235 Convention Administrative Committee – Subsection D -2 “Bylaws and Administrative Procedures Committee”

Currently Reads: Administrative Procedures- SECTION 235 - Subsection D-2 Bylaws and administrative procedures committee shall review and present all proposed changes of the National Bylaws and Administrative Procedures properly submitted in accordance with the requirements of the National Bylaws and Administrative Procedures. The committee, by a majority vote, shall either approve or disapprove, without personal bias, all properly registered National Bylaws and Administrative Procedures revisions considered by the Committee. The Committee chairman will report the Committee’s recommendations to the National convention and then present the amendments to the body for acceptance or rejection. (Rev.08/14) Allowance will be available for those Committee members in attendance at the Bylaws meeting during the National convention for the years the National Bylaws are revised, amended or repealed. (Rev. 08/12)

Amend: Administrative Procedures- SECTION 235 - Subsection D-2 Bylaws and administrative procedures committee shall review and present all proposed changes of the National Bylaws and Administrative Procedures properly submitted in accordance with the requirements of the National Bylaws and Administrative Procedures. The committee, by a majority vote, shall either approve or disapprove, without personal bias, all properly registered National Bylaws and Administrative Procedures revisions considered by the Committee. The Committee chairman will report the Committee’s recommendations to the National convention and then present the amendments to the body for acceptance or rejection. (Rev.08/14)

Brief: **Delete** the (Rev. 08/12) “Allowance will be available for those Committee members in attendance at the Bylaws meeting during the National convention for the years the National Bylaws are revised, amended or repealed.”

Rationale: The Bylaws have to be submitted to National *not less than 90 days prior* to the opening of the National Convention (Section 800) and requires a straight up or down vote from the body. The Committees' purpose is to recommend or not recommend the bylaw change as submitted. The process of agreeing for a recommendation does not require them to be in attendance since this can be done prior to Convention by email, text, postal mail or telephone. (should be no different as Section 235 (A)) Therefore, no allowance should be needed for this committee.

This would be effective after the approval of the National Judge Advocate of the Marine Corps League, no later than 01 January 2020.
