Happy St. Patrick's Day!

As I am writing this article, I can not believe it is only 21 days until Spring. I hope everyone is enjoying the warmer weather and sunshine. Spring makes me think of new beginnings and cleaning up for a better start to the year.

I know many Units have their election of new officers in the Spring. Please be mindful that new officers must be installed within 30 days of the election or at the next scheduled meeting. This is covered in Bylaws Section 530.

It is also the president-elect who choses her installing officer and the necessary staff. It is the responsibility of the installing officer to forward the installation form (ROI) to the proper authorities. This is covered in Administrative Procedures Section 620.



When electing your new officers, please keep in mind that a new or reinstated member must be a member for one year before holding an elected office and must be a new or reinstated member for three months before holding an appointed office. This is covered in Bylaws Section 630.

When is your Unit's Fiscal Year? Did you know that the fiscal year of the Marine Corps League Auxiliary is July 1 to June 30 of each year? This means that all Departments, Units and Subsidiary/Subordinate Organizations shall have the same fiscal year. This is covered in Administrative Procedures Section 1035.

Having just returned from Mid-Winter makes me think of National Convention, which means it's time to be thinking about bylaws changes. Any member may submit a proposed revision, amendment or repeal within 90 days prior to the first day of the National Convention. With the first day of convention being August 12, 2024, the last day to submit is May 14, 2024.



History Book Chair

As I prepare for the upcoming Central Division Conference, I have been thinking about ways to break the ice among the many auxiliary members that may not know our sisters from their own state, or other states in the division. A trivia quiz is one way to begin the interaction. There are the tried-and-true questions about the auxiliary, which we bring out each year. But I thought it might be nice to learn about our history. And then, I received an email informing me that I am a 1%er!

I relate this phrase to our active duty and veterans of the military services. Most people are aware that only 1% of our population have served in the Armed Forces to protect all of us. This is rather alarming overall, but since I have not served in that capacity, I have made it my personal mission to serve the veterans and to educate my community about their service and sacrifices made for our opportunities and freedoms.

So, how did I become a 1%er? Simply by being one of those born between 1930 and 1946 (worldwide) and surviving today. 99% of those born during that time are now dead. We are the last generation to climb out of the Great Depression. We remember the impact of a world at war and its effects on our daily lives. I still have a gas ration book in my name so that my parents could take me to the doctor. We had no television, so we played outside or read books. The Diary of Anne Frank is still a personal favorite. We listened to Hop Along Cassidy on Saturday radio. Evenings were quiet time as Dad and Grandpa listened to the news. We cherished photo albums and listened to stories about our ancestors and of their contributions to our community and the world. We relied on encyclopedias for facts and research. The internet was not even an idea to us. We were lucky to have a party line telephone. We learned to appreciate everything that we had, no matter how small and to dream of a future that would be rich and comfortable.

So, my mission now is to scour all material available about our history. The miracle of modern day, internet is my source. This is what I have so far: "The Marine Corps League Auxiliary was chartered on September 4, 1937, as a subsidiary organization of the Marine Corps League, Inc. On August 25, 1950, the Auxiliary was incorporated under the laws of the District of Columbia as an affiliate of the Marine Corps League, Inc.

The Auxiliary was formed for the purposes of promoting the interests of the United States Marine Corps, the Marine Corps League, Inc., and to protect and advance the welfare of Marines and their dependents. Auxiliary members participate in a wide variety of programs that benefit and preserve the fundamental rights and freedoms of every person of this nation, young and old."




